

## **E-forms Only**

Some of you may recall OISS previously used paper forms — hard to imagine, now! Although these paper forms have been removed from our website, you can still find them using a search engine, like Google.

Therefore, if you're looking for information about a certain request, you'll get the best results by using our Student Request Guide or the search function within our website. OISS only accepts e-forms submitted through UCSBGlobal.

### Avoid Falling Out of Status

Unfortunately, OISS advisors occasionally meet with students or scholars who have fallen out of status due to either not reading emails (sent to their UCSB email address) from OISS or not closely following directions provided to them.

Email is the official way for UCSB departments to communicate with students and scholars; OISS will notify you of crucial information via email, which you can view in your UCSB email inbox or UCSBGlobal.

We cannot emphasize enough the importance of reading emails OISS sends. In addition to always opening our messages, it may be helpful to periodically search for our office name in your email inbox and double-check any message notifications you see in UCSBGlobal.

When we see that students or scholars have opened messages, but failed to take the required action to maintain their status, they sometimes tell us it's because they skimmed the message or thought it was a scam. Please read our message carefully and always ask if you would like any clarification or have follow up questions. Similarly, if you are ever wondering if a certain message is a scam, please contact our office and we would be happy to take a look. You can also check your UCSBGlobal account to verify an email is legitimate - if you receive the same message in both your email and on UCSBGlobal, then it checks out

The Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS) is excited to announce that UCSBGlobal has gone mobile! You can now submit e-forms from your phone using the UCSBGlobal mobile application.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Who is the app for? International students and scholars who use UCSBGlobal to submit requests to OISS.

#### Is the UCSBGlobal app required?

No, but it is highly recommended. The app allows UCSBGlobal users to fill out e-forms on their phones and receive relevant push notifications.

#### Why should I enable push notifications?

So that you don't miss an essential immigration update! Push notifications will only be used to alert students and scholars of the most time-sensitive immigration information. The notifications will not be used for event advertising or non-urgent updates. We kindly ask that you enable the notifications, which will be functional in the near future.

#### Can I continue using the UCSBGlobal website?

Yes. You are welcome to continue using the UCSBGlobal website to submit e-forms. But if you wish to submit e-forms from your phone, then you will need to download the UCSBGlobal app.

Friday Dec 2 2 - 4 pm OISS Conference Room (SRB 3rd Floor)



Who needs a travel signature?

Any student who will be traveling outside the U.S. needs a valid travel signature to re-enter.

How long is a student's travel signature valid?

Travel signatures are valid for up to one year from the date they are signed. Your travel signature must be valid at the time of re-entry to the U.S.
