Full Course Load

Are you enrolled full-time yet? Be sure to register in a full course load to maintain your visa status this quarter.

Grad students need at least 8 units and undergraduate students need at least 12 units. If you need assistance registering for classes, please contact an academic advisor in your college.

J-1 Student Employment

Employment authorization is mandatory for all J-1 students (EAP or grad student) for any type of work.

Before beginning an on campus position or off campus (Academic Training) position, employment authorization is needed.

Working without proper employment authorization is a visa status violation. Our<u>J-1</u> <u>Employment page</u> provides more information about getting the right authorization.
