OISS Reminders

President's Work Study Program



We are now accepting applications for the University of California President's Work Study Program for the 2023-2024 academic year. If you receive a President's Work-Study award through OISS, any department that hires you only has to pay 40% of your salary. The Office of the President pays the other 60%. This makes you a more attractive job candidate since departments do not have to use as much of their annual budget to support your position. You can receive up to \$1,100 as a Graduate student and \$500 as an undergraduate student for each quarter that you are enrolled during the President's Work-Study award year.

Don't forget to update your local living address within 10 days of moving. This is a federal immigration requirement.

To update your address, log into <u>UCSBGlobal</u> and navigate to the Personal Information Update eform. You will see an option to update your local living address.

ICE Fraud Advisory

SEVP is reminding school officials and students to beware of a scam involving individuals using the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) Response Center (SRC) phone numbers (703-603-3400 and 800-892-4829) and to be SRC claiming representatives. Remember, never give out your personal or financial information. If you are contacted by anyone claiming be government official. US international. OISS contact immediately.

Housing Scam Warning

OISS, in partnership with University and Community Housing Services (UCHS), would like to remind everyone to stay alert and diligent in your search for local housing. We have seen a large uptick in housing/rental scams so please proceed with caution! <u>University and Community Housing Services</u> recommends checking with their office directly before signing leases or sending money for deposits.

Remember, housing options that look too good to be true are likely scams. Take the extra step and email UCHS to verify any questionable housing postshousinginfo@housing.ucsb.edu and read OISS' webpage for more tips and information on <u>avoiding</u> <u>scams</u>.
