Global Gaucho Friendship

WELCOMING INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Welcome to UCSB, an institution that loves international students, also known as Global Gauchos. Every part of the UCSB community is enriched by the perspectives and contributions of our Global Gauchos. Read on to see how you can advance Global Gaucho friendship.

Being a Friend to a Global Gaucho

- Ask Global Gaucho what name they prefer to go by, and don't be hesitant to ask them how to pronounce it
- Ask them how their experience in the U.S. has been so far
- Understand that they may be experiencing feelings of loneliness, culture shock and homesickness
- Explain jokes, idioms, and cultural references used in class that may only be understood by domestic students
- Understand that these students are attending a high-ranking research university with English as their second (or third or fourth!) language, while adjusting to a new education level, environment, country, etc. Try imagining if you were in their shoes.
- · Ask them about their own culture
- Include them in and out of the classroom (i.e. socials, group projects, etc.)

- Working on campus with your peers is another way you could meet friends
- Give yourself time and grace. Friendships don't always happen immediately and it may take time to find community.
